

## **Neighbourhood Plan progress report for the 3<sup>rd</sup> November Markfield Parish Council meeting**

1 The extended consultation period on the pre-submission version of the Neighbourhood Plan closes on 13<sup>th</sup> November 2020.

2. The consultation period was advertised through the following routes:

- A letter for every house in the parish.
- The NP website.
- The Neighbourhood Plan Facebook site.
- Another local Facebook site.
- Emails to local firms, neighbouring parish councils, HBBC, the LCC, statutory consultees, like Natural England, and many others. Where emails failed, paper copies were posted to company's/individual's addresses.
- HBBC contacted all the landowners/developers/land agents relating to all the SHLAA sites

3 As of 28<sup>th</sup> October 2020 33 representations have been received and logged on the NP Teams representation spreadsheet. Most representations so far received are from local residents.

4. It is however expected there may be a flurry of representations from developers/landowners close to the closing date.

5 All representations received will be reported to the Parish Council in December, along with "responses" and any "actions" necessary, in terms of altering the wording of the Neighbourhood Plan .It should be noted that this will be a substantial report.

6 Some time ago the NPSG/PC were approached by Savills, for views on a "vision statement" they were promoting for a possible warehouse development on the northern side of the A50, adjacent to M1 junction 22. Savills have now asked if they might give a presentation about the proposal to the PC/NPSG. I have asked them to contact the parish clerk.

7. Thanks are given to the parish clerk for assisting, at short-notice, with consultation emails and letters.
